## A Large Mor mon Immigration Expected.

THREE THOUSAND MORMONS TO ARRIVE FROM-EUROPE THIS SUMMER.

Mr. T. B. H. Stenhouse, editor of the Salt Lake City Daily Telegraph, and Mr. Thomas Taylor, agent for Mormon immigration, arrived here to day from Utah. They report that the territory is m a flourishing condition. Mr. Taylor comes east to prepare for the reception of a large number of Mormon immigrants, who are expected to arrive here early in the summer. About one thousand are to come from Norway and Sweden, and probably seventeen hundred from England. Others will arrive from various parts of the continent. In all, about three thousand Mormons from Europe are now preparing to emigrate to Utab, to cast in their lot for life with the disciples of Brigham Young, There are now about one hundred Mormon missionaries in Europe, working under the direc-tion of "Brother Brigham," and encouraging emigration. Mr. Taylor is about to open an office in this city, in which the general business of the Mormon immigration will be conducted. -N. Y. Evening Post, 15th.

Naval Intelligence.

REDUCTION OF THE COAST SQUADBONS. In pursuance of orders received from the Navy Department, our coast squadrons, known respectively as the Atlantic and Gulf Squadrons, respectively as the Atlantic and Gull Squatrons, are being rapidly reduced. Within the past month no less than four vessels have been de-tached from the Gulf Squadron and ordered to various Northern ports to be laid up or sold, as may be deemed best. The vessels selected for removal are generally those which have seen the next active service and before setting the most active service, and before another month it is expected that more than half the vessels now doing duty in the above-mentioned squadrons will be laid up in ordinary or sold. A large sale of unserviceable war vessels will shortly take place at the Brocklyn Navy Yard, to which a majority of the vessels to be laid up will be sent. While our home squadrors are being largely reduced, the Navy Department has steadily kept making increases to the squadrons assigned to duty in foreign waters, and even now our foreign fleets bear (avorable comparison with those of the great naval powers of Europe There are now over thirty vessels fitting out for foreign service, a large number of them being intended for the South Pacific and Asiatic squadrons.

A NEW STYLE OF STEAMBOAT, -A steamboat on a new plan has just been launched at St. Denis to convey passengers from Paris to St. Croud during the Exhibition of 1867. It consists of an elegant soloon in two compartments. covered over with movable glass frames, so that the passengers may enjoy an uninterrupted view of the country, and at the same time be sheltered from rain and the heat of the sun.

EXTRAORDINARY CASE OF HYDROPHOBIA.-A girl thurleen years of age, the daughter of an innkeeper named Guyor, residing at Neuville-les-Dames (Ain). France, has just died from hydrophobia, attgr three days of dreadful suf-ferings. She had never been bitten by a dog, but had often played with one belonging to her father, which was killed in a rabid state. As she sometimes allowed the animal to lick her face at a time when she had a small sore on her lip, the virus is supposed to have been communicated to her in that manner.
