LEARS, ETC. RICHMOND, June 3.—Any indications of a proba-ble or possible trial of Jefferson Davis are at present necessarily vagne. No one in the city in official centres or among the immediate counsel of the pit-soner is able to intimate at what time the trial may take place. The usual authorities seek for informa-tion rather than profess to impart it. The town is quiet, and barely a rumor prevails of the Govern-men's intention.

 We even hear that Mr. Davis is not to be tried at all; certainly not how, or before October or December.
 Except by the mere presence of his counsel, the prisonor himself has received no official forewarning, while according to the act of Congress he most receive a copy of the charges and a list of the juriors before the trial can occur. The Court over which Judge Underwood presides, is to meet to morrow, and such proceedings as there will take place may throw better light on the subject. There is an apprehension among the criticons that the Chief Justice will preside at the trial; but of this, Mr. Davis' own counsel confess themselves ignorant.

We learn from Fortress Monroe that it is not ex-pected that Davis will leave the fort.—N. Y. Tribunc.

JUAREZ WILLING TO HAND OVER THE REINS TO SANTA ANNA-A NATIONAL CONVENTION TO BE CALLED. ETC.

Santa Anna, it was expected, would call a national con-vention in order to ascertain the will of the majority of the people regarding the form of government mostacceptable to the country."




