YE ADMIRAL RISLEY UNDER FULL SAIL.

BULL PARTICULARS OF THE SIZE O YE YACHTS.

The Series Editor, attracted by the display of prizes offered by Admiral Risley, and the display of bunting at the Camden wharves, started last Tuesday on a sailing excursion down the noble Delaware.
