Basz answered the despatch, and wante i to enter into negotiations; but, owing to the rumor that the garrison had opened the gate of the city to the invading army, banic and consternation prevailed. Basz sought an asylum in the French Consulate. The cry was at the Consulate 'Scauce gai paus.'' The protection of that flag saved him from the mob, to whose fury he would otherwise have been sacri- ficed. A Provisional Government was installed, under General Fimentel, and order was soon re-established. It was determined to demand Mr. Basz from the French Consul for trial; but after mature considera- tion it was decided, to prevent any further disturb- ance, to send him his passports and get rid of him. He was flually allowed to embark on board the Spanish steemer Barcelona. His brother, Damian Basz and General Pedro Guillermo, the one who aided the riot that brought Mr. Basz to power, have been imprisoned, and will be tried as incendiaries.
