The proceedings of the meeting were opened at 4 o'clock P. M. Most of the notable players from the different sections of the country were repre-sented either in person or by proxy. Among the "champions" present were Michael Pnethe "champions" present were Michael Phe-lan, Esq., the renowned promoter of the tilliard science in this country; his business pariner, Mr. Coiarder; Gershon P. Hubbell, of this city; Mr. McDevitt, R. T. Ryall, Mr. Foley, of Illi-nois, and Mr. Daniels, of Massachusetts. The chair was, on motion, taken by Mr. Hubbell, and Mr. D. E. Gavitt was appointed Secretary. The Chairman having thanked the meeting for the honor conjected on him, explained the the honor conterred on him, explained the object of the gathering, and reterred to the beneficial influence which would follow the establishment of annual tournaments, by which a proper spirit of competition would be created among all leading players.


