masses of the Union party. His nomination would, therefore, have been a strong one, and might have told heavily upon the Republican organization throughout the State. But the result of the elections in Vermont and Maine has demonstrated the fact that the conservative Republicans, or Johnson Republicans, are a myth. They figure well on paper, in Conventions, and in the distribution of offices, but they have no votes. Weed, Raymond & Co. have no constituency-they sepresent nobody. Hence, the Democracy of New York have evidently determined to fall back upon their own proper strength for the 'all campaign. They have virtually abandoned the contest in the "rural districts," and are making their real fight in New York city. There, in that great centre of ignorance and corruption, that vast camp of disloyalty, where the draft riots held their carnival during the darkest hours of the national struggle, and where, to-day, Jeff. Davis or Robert E. Lee would command more votes than Grant or Sherman, there they expect to roll up a majority large enough to overwhelm the votes of the loyal, intelligent, and sober masses of the interior. The plan is a desperate one, and we do not believe it can succeed. At all events, it abandons the vital point in the present contest, viz., the control of the Congressional delegation. The Union party expect to elect no Congressmen from the city, or, at most, not more than one. Hence a majority of twenty, thirty, or forty thousand for the Democrats in the city will not add a single man to the number of Congressmen they will control, while, in thus transferring the burden of the fight from the country to the city. and in abandoning the August Convention movement by throwing Dix overboard, they have made the Congressional race an easier one for every Republican nominee in the State who at any time has stood any show for success. In other words, they have abandoned the Congressional fight for a dubious and desperate venture upon the Governor. Well may the Herald and kindred sheets, that 'discern tue signs of the times." treat the canvass as already virtually decided in favor of the Republicans. A recent visit to Western New York, the great stronghold of Unionism in the State, satisfies us that the cause is safe. The Johnson movement has no strength there whatever. We inquired diligently for detections

from the Union ranks, but they were not to be tound, while the Republicans were confident of giving Fenton and the whole ticket a heavier vote than ever before. One cause, not generally thought of, is adding to the Union vote everywhere; and that is, that nine-tenths of the young men who are just of age, and who will this fall cast their first votes, are with us.
