THE CHIGNON CRAWLERS.

Live Rems from the Heads of the People. The publication of the "Chignon Horror,' revealed by a scientific writer in the London Lancet, showing that in every "waterfall" not composed of the natural hair of the wearer (and possibly in cases even where the hair is natural) there are myriads of parasitic gregarines, has called out numerous communications on the subject, all lively and prolific in suggestions, from which we select the following :---

They are located in juxtaposition to the bumps of ama-tiveness, and the warmth of these bumps produces the pediculi at once, and in any quantity, with no apparent exhaustion to the waterfall wearer, If the waterfalls were worn in any other place on the head, there would be no spontaneous generation of gregarines, though the production might continue from other and quite natural causes. 
