FULL PARTICULARS BY THE DOG SLEDGES

MR. SERIES EDITOR; - As the fast mail dog train is about leaving, I must enclose, for the benefit of your readers, some little account of the new territory that will soon seek to send

to Congress. This is the abode of the Walrus, the Polar Bear, the Sable, and other citizens of foreign birth; and while your Government is doing so much for their Southern sable brethren, I hope they will not forget their

who are in as great need of reconstruction as any race can be. The fraternising qualities of many of the natives here are beyond all praise. The first day I landed I was



RECEIVED WITH OPEN ARMS by the principal resident of the place, and he pressed me very hard to stay, although I was desirous of pushing on farther. I see that a great number of people are going to make an excursion this summer to the East: if I could only persuade them to make it to the Northwest, I could promise them any amount of pleasure. For a summer residence this place has no superiors: ice is abundant, and the landscape always presents a clean, white appearance, as if whitewashed, as far as the eye can reach. The fishing is good, and

The weather is what might be called "bracing," and the towns and burgs are all ice-bergs, and the magistrate is quite an ice-

berger. The Russian settlement here is a very enterprising place. In the middle of the town you can turn and see a snow hut in almost any direction. But the "wooded tract" Mr. Seward speaks of is rather poor this year. No one need sing, "Woodman, Spare That Tree !" as the trees are quite spare enough already. Stopping at the "Continental" of the place, I made arrangements with the landlord to furnish me with something to eat. The agreement was closed by him setting the official Seal on it, but it was such a rare

dish that I had to hold off for a better appetite. The walruses supply the place of cows. They pasture them on cakes of ice, and of course they furnish the natives with all the ice-cream they use. You are not troubled with mosquitoes nor worms on the trees, and early frosts never threaten to injure the peach crop, as we are told they always do in your part of the country, and the North Pole is always at hand to affix the telegraph wires to or to grow beans upon. The "skating rinks" are on the most extended scale, and but for the coolness that exists between everybody here, I have no doubt they would be well patronized. The principal occupation of the natives is trying to get something to eat, and of strangers to keep from being eaten. I visited all of the important points along the coast, and found them quite slippery and covered with ice, and I do not think an enemy could easily get a foothold on this land, on that account.

Your political meetings are more than rivalled by the "big fish" out here, and some of the tallest "spouting" I have ever seen I have seen here.

I think any enterprising person could strike oil out here without much difficulty, as it abounds everywhere, and with a few derricks erected over some of the whales a Sperm City could be built up that would rival any Oil City of your own State.

I think our Government has done well in buying this place, for I never saw a place that was so much in need of buying; and as a country to emigrate from, it is not equalled by any. If Andy and Billy ever want to "swing the circle" again, they can use the Arctic Circle for that purpose, without asking anybody's leave. Yours, P. Bear.
