TERRITORIAL GOVERNORS—Case of Colonel Alexander Cummings.

WASHINGTON, April 15. Territorial Governors—Case of Colonel Alexander Cummings. The President today sent a message to the Senate, enclosing communications from the Secretary of the Interior, the Attorney-General, and the Secretary of State. The latter, to whom was also referred the resolution of the Senate, requesting the President to inform that body how often the Governors, Secretaries, and Judges of the several Territories have been absent from their posts of duty in the Territories since their appointments, etc., says the department has no information in regard to the absence of territorial judges.
