DISTRICT COURT - Judge Sharswood. - This court sat to-day to resume the trial of the case of lexis R. Conkiln vs. Theodore Adams. It will be remembered that this is an action to recover damages for deceit alleged to have been practised by defendant upon plaintiff. The defendant was one of the firm of Adams & Levis, brokers, in Cheanut street, above Third. He also was a Government contraction, and he obtained a contract for building 400 miles of telegraph. He told Mr. Conkiln of this, and, saying be could not attend to this and his interest in the firm of Adams & Levis, he offered to sell that laterent to Mr. Conkiln. He held out to that gentleman that the firm was worth \$700.000, and his interest well worth \$100.000, in securities and outstanding debts against many of the best moneyed men in the city. Mr. Conkiln bought this interest, paying \$65,800 in whisky, \$15,000 in cush, and \$20,000 in slocks. But when he attempted to recover his money by setting these claims against "the best nen is the city," he discovered that some of them did not know the form of Adams & Levis, some had bad no dealings with it, and to others this firm was included—so that altogether he recovered only about \$25,000. And it is alleged that defendant knew these starements to be faire when he made them.

The deciense alleged that when Mr. Adams went into the firm of Adams & Levis, he placed in the concern \$100.000 in cash. Mr. Levis attended to all the business of the standing of the books, except what he heard from Mr. Levis. Mr. Adams had intended to leave the city and take up the contract of building telegraph lines, and he wished to close up this interest in this firm. Mr. Conkiln had frequently stone business fr Mr. Levis, and he really stem more about the business of a broker, particularly that of Adams Levis, than Mr. Adams did.
