BOARD OF GUARDIANS OF THE POOR.—The regular stated meeting of the Board of Guardians of the Poor was held yesterday afternoon, at the Almshouse.

The total number of inmates in the Almshouse is 2865, showing a decrease of 149 for the same time last year.

The Steward reported the house receipts at \$1770, and the out-door having collected for support cases, \$603.25; and the emigrant tax, \$385.

The report of the Board of Visitors shows that out-door relief had been granted during the month of April to 3571 persons, at an expense of \$1543.11.

The election to fill the vacancy in the Medical Board was proceeded with, and resulted in favor of Dr. William Pepper.
