QUEEN VICTORIA TO BUILD A CLOTHING. **QUEEN HORTAL HOSPITAL.** An English paper makes the following an-mouncement:—The Queen is about to perform an act of great munificence. During the five years that she has remained in retirement she has necessarily accumulated a large portion of her privy purse allowance, which, under han-pier dircumstances, would have been spent in royal hospitality, both to her own subjects and to foreign princes. Her Majesty, desiring it should not be supposed that she "and saved this money for marsimonions" reasons, has resolved to give no less a sum than had a million ster-ling for the Crection of a convalescent hospital. The matter bitherio has been kept very quiet, but it is believed that the money has been already made over to trustees, and the royal bounty will before long be made known off-cally. The new institution will be built more ospecially in connection with St. Bartholo-mew's Hospital, and the treasurer and other of that renowned charity will be sumong the trustees. It is proposed to spend about 200,000 in purchasing the site and erecting the building, and to keep the remainder of the sum in hand for the present.
