

THE INCOME TAX IN ENGLAND AND THE UNITED STATES.

A Comparison—The English System.

The London Times has the following interesting article:—The rival systems of taxation in Great Britain and the United States have been repeatedly contrasted by our statesmen and financiers, but the comparison is not to be carried on more closely than was possible either before the civil war or immediately after that desperate struggle. The estimates, in fact, originally proposed by the American Secretary of the treasury for the year ending with the current month comprised a revenue not greatly differing from that of our own Government. The Americans were to raise £70,000,000, while on the other side of the sheet they provide £28,000,000 for interest on the national debt, instead of the £20,000,000 which we have for that obligation in our own case.
