A proposition was then made to go into a ballot for a candidate for the office of Sheriff. The motion was lost, and, on motion, General Lyle was declared to be the unanimous choice of the Convention for that office.

As soon as quiet was restored, General Lyle was introduced, and made an address, thanking the Convention for the honor thus shown him, and pledging his influence and efforts for the advancement of the interests of the Democratic party. General Lyle, on taking his seat, re-ceived continued applause. He was followed by Messrs. Megary, Campbell, and others. The Convention then adjourned.

THE LATE SANGERFEST-PRESENTATION OF TESTIMONIALS.—Yesterday afternoon a number of exizets, appreciating the efforts of the com-mittee in charge of the Sængerfest, determined to convey to the parties concerned a testimonial of their regard. At 3 o'clock the party assem-oled at the rooms of the German Society, Eeventh street, above Chesnut; there two mag-minicent watches, and five silver goblets were disclosed. Uncome of the watches was indisplayed. Upon one of the watches was in-scribed:--"Testimonial to Prof. L. Engelke, Musical Director of the Tenth National Sænger-fest, from citizens of Philadelphia. M. Richards Muckle, Lorenz Herbert, Joseph Kimicke, Committee, July, 1867." A watch was also pre-sented to J. Henry Camp, President of the Sæn-geriest. The silver gobiets were presented as follows:-To L. Braun, Vice-President; M. Lan-denberger, Treasurer; H. G. Runkle, Recording Secretary: C. Marcus Bauman, Corresponding Secretary; C. Secretary: Ernest Reistle, Financial Secretary. When the company was assembled, Mr. Muckle introduced the recipients of the gitts, whereapon Mr. J. B. Nicholson made the presentation speech in a few pertinent remarks, returning the gratitude of each recipient. On behalf of those receiving the watches and

goblets Mr. Camp responded. Mayor McMichael was called upon to respond

to a toast. The Mayor said that he was glad to meet his German fellow-citizens at this time, and that among the happlest memories of his life would be the visit to the picnic of the Sængerfest, and that among all the incidents of his public life this would stand foremost. He asserted that he said not a word in the State House upon the reception of the singers that was not endorsed by the people at large. He had been a participant in their festivities, and knew that not a word could be said against them on the score of propriety and order. The Mayor concluded with an elequent enlogy of the German as an important element in the composition of society.

General Patterson was called out. The General, in a humorous speech expressed his surprise that thirty or forty thousand people could meet together and pass the day without a row. He had been a witness of the harmony and union that characterized the grand picnic, and he contessed that he was surprised at the good order that prevailed. He hoped the Germans would continue to engraft upon American institutions the sports and amusements to which they were attached.

Speeches were also made by M. Richards Muckle, Theo. H. Vetterlein, Dr. Hein, Dr. Engle, and Mr. Camp.


