NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO THE FREEMEN OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF PHILADELPHIA, THAT

On Tuesday, October 8, 1867.

Being the Second Tuesday of the month, and day of the General and Municipal Election, there are to be elected, viz:—

By the Freemen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, one qualified person to serve as one of the Justices of the Supreme Court of said Commonwealth for five years...

By the Freemen residing in the First Ward, one person to serve as a member of the Board of Public Schools, four of them for three years, and one for the unexpired term of three years...

By the Freemen residing in the Second Ward, one person to serve as a member of the Board of Public Schools, four of them for three years, and one for the unexpired term of three years...

By the Freemen residing in the Third Ward, one person to serve as a member of the Board of Public Schools, four of them for three years, and one for the unexpired term of three years...

By the Freemen residing in the Fourth Ward, one person to serve as a member of the Board of Public Schools, four of them for three years, and one for the unexpired term of three years...
