OUR GUARDIAN ANGELS.

A Sermon Delivered by the Very Rev. William O'Hara, D. D., at St. Michael's Church, on Sunday Morning.

The following report of the interesting sermon delivered at St. Michael's Church, on Sunday morning, by the Very Rev. William O'Hara, D. D., is published for the benefit of the community.

Another Rally.—The Great Mass Meeting on the Old York Road.—Last evening the citizens of the Sixth, Eleventh, Twelfth, and Thirteenth wards, composing the Third Senatorial District, met in mass meeting on the Old York Road, above Callowhill street.

Among these proposals was the one for \$2000 for six heaters, while the \$1200 proposal referred to in the resolution of Councils was for four heaters. The committee deemed the \$2000 proposition the cheapest, and so recommended, but the contract with the party making the bid has not been executed.

Acting upon this belief, the Committee of the Board had sought to protect the interests of the city by the circumstances connected with the contract with a proposal before awarding a contract.

Further inquiry on this subject was postponed for the present, in order to allow the author of the resolution in Common Council to appear before the Committee, and give such information as he might possess.

In regard to the alterations in the specifications of the contract for the Thirteenth Section, Mr. Shippin stated that it was time that there had been such alterations, and a Committee of the Board of Control was now engaged in investigating the subject in order to ascertain what the alterations were, and how they were applied to inside shutters to the building, and involved an additional expense of less than \$2000. The subject was postponed.

The Guardians of the Poor.—The stated meeting of the Board of Guardians of the Poor was held yesterday afternoon at the Almshouse, West Philadelphia, John M. Whittall, President, in the chair.

The following census of the House was reported by the House Agent, Number in the House at 12 o'clock on Saturday morning, 2887; male time last year, 2564—increased 33; admitted the last two weeks, 200; birth, 11; deaths, 15; discharged, 142; ejected, 24; in the House, 13; number of persons granted lodgings within the last two weeks, 30; meals, 130.

The persons in the various departments are classified as follows:—Males, 1000; females, 480; aged, 160; confirmed lunatics, 41; temporary lunatics, 119; epileptics, 25; imbeciles, 22; idiots, 4; Children's Asylum—boys, 130; Women's Department—Spirits, 105; diseased incurables, 54; healthy females, 365; confirmed lunatics, 118; temporary lunatics, 193; epileptics, 50; imbeciles, 26; idiots, 6; Children's Asylum—girls, 71. Total males and females in insane Department, less assistants, 608.

The Treasurer reported that he had paid into the City Treasury since last report the sum of \$3151.55.

The storekeeper reported that there had been received, since last report, 160 lamps of various kinds, the net weight of which was 1333 pounds.

The Board then went into an election for resident physicians, resulting in the choice of Drs. Dwight, Beecher, Rex, Vanharsling, and Botford. Dr. Muhlbarg was also elected to fill a vacancy in the Insane Department. The Board then went into a nomination for officers to serve for the ensuing year.
