In accordance with the provisions of the Eighth Section of an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, approved the Fourth day of June, A. D. 1868, the following Preamble and First Four Sections of raid Act are published, to wit:

Whereas, hy the Act of the United States entitled "An Act to amend the soveral acts herefoliore passed to provide for the enroll; g and calling out the National forces, and or other purposes," and approved March 3, one thousand eight hundred and systy-five, all persons who have deserted the milliary or maval service of the United States, and who have not been discharged or relieved from the penalty or disability therein provided, are deemed and taken to have voluntarily relinquished and firsteed their rights of citizenship and their rights to become citizens, and are deprived of exercising any rights of citizens, and whereas, Persons, not citizens of the United States.

And whereas, Persons, not citizens of the United states, are not, under the Constitution and laws of connections, qualified electors of the Common-

Sates, are not, under the Comstitution and laws of Pennsylvania, qualified electors of the Commonwealth.

Section 1.—Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That in all elections hereafter to be held in this Commonwealth, it shall be unlawful for the Judge or Inspectors of any such election to receive any ballot or ballots from any person or persons embraced in the provisions and subject to the disability imposed by the said act of Congress, approved March 2, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-live, and it shall be unlawful for any such person to offer to voic any ballot or ballots.

Section 2.—That if any such Judge and Inspectors of Election, or any one of them, speal receive or consent to receive any such unlawful ballot or ballots from any such disqualified person, he or they so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof in any Court of Quarter Sessions of this Commonwealth, he shall, for each offense, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, and to undergo an imprisonment in the jail of the proper county for not less than sixty days.

Section 8.—That if a y person deprived of clitzenship and disqualified as aforesaid, shall, at any election hereafter to be held in this Commonwealth, vote or tender to the officers thereof and offer to vote, a ballot or ballots; any person so offending, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and one conviction thereof, in any Court of Quarter Sessions of this Commonwealth, shall for each offense be punished in like man, er as is provided in this Commonwealth, vote of clitzenship and disqualified as aforesaid, should be resident or ballots.

Section 4.—That if any person shall hereafter persuade or advise any person deprived of clitzenship and disqualified as aforesaid; such person so offending shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, in any Court of Quarter Sessions
