## CITY INTELLIGENCE. SFOR ADDITIONAL LOCAL STHME SEE OUTSIDE PAGES.

MEETING OF THE PARK COMMISSIONERS .- The Park Commissioners held a meeting yesterday, for the purpose of receiving and considering reports from the Committee on Plans and Committee on Engineers. Mr. Graeff, chairman of the Committee on

Engineers, submitted a long and interesting report upon the supply of Schuylkill water. The report stated that the Schuylkill water is not only the purest water that can be obtained, but that the stream is adequate for the prospective wants of the people for generations to come.

The sluggishness of the stream gave an oppor-tunity for all objectionable matters to set le to the bottom, while the large quantities of sal-phuric acid from the mining districts, mixing with the water coming from a limestone region, rendered the water coming from a imestone region, rendered the water exceeding) pure. The re-port, after giving the quantity of water an-nually furnished by the river, the number of inhabitants to be supplied at present, and the probable number for the next 6 ty years, recommends the building of more reservoirs for the storage of water to be used in seasons of greatstorage of water to be used in seasons of great-est demand, and in the event of accidents to the works; also, the extension of the Park to the Wis-ahlekon, so as to prevent the creetion of manufactories, etc., along the stream of the river, from the Wissahickon to some point below Fairmount dam. The report was accepted, and it will be laid before Councils.

Mr. Theodore Cuyler, chairman of the Com-mittee on Plans, also submitted a valuable report, stating that "the preservation of the purity of the water supply of the city of Philadelphia is declared in the act of Assembly to be one of the chief objects of the Park." The ground proposed to be embraced in this Park the Com mission think absolutely necessary to carry out the objects of the act of Assembly, and also give to the citizens of Philadelphin a Park not only noble in its proportions, but peculiarly adapted for the purpose, and can be embellished at a far less cost than that of any other great park of which the Commission have any know-ledge. The Park propored will contain over twelve hundred acres, including the water sur-face, and over six hundred acres of it already belongs to the city. A broad carriage road on both sides of the river, as far up as the Wissa-hickon, is also one of the propositions contained in the report.

CHARGE AGAINST POLICEMEN.—A hearing took place yesterday alternoon, before Alderman Dougherty, in the case of Officers L. T. Manue-here and G. H. It is said that they refused to return, and took Mr. Markwald to the Union Street Station House. He was there placed in a cell and kept until between I and 2 o'clock on Tuesday, when he was placed in the prison van and taken to Moyamensing prison. The defen-dants were each required to enter ball in \$1200 to answer at Court. to answer at Court.

FALLING OF A DEREICK .- Yesterday after-FALLING OF A DERRICK.— Festerday after-noon, about half-past four o'elock, a derrick fell at the old Pennsylvania Bank building, at which some thirty men were engaged. Six of them were injured, and one of them, named Michael Duvall, residing at Third and South streets, was badly injured about the head and shoulders. He was taken to bis residence in a feeble condi-tion, and the injuries received are considered outle serious. The others were injured more or quite serious. The others were injured more or less, but were able to walk to their homes. A large stone was being raised at the time of the occurrence of the accident, which was produced by a stay giving away. Quite an alarm was created in the neighborhood by the occurrence, for a time, and it was supposed that a greater amount of injury had been occusioned than was really the case.

BURGLARY.-Last evening, about half-past 10 o'clock, a private watchman saw a man coming out of Bullock's cloth store, at Second and Chesnut streets. On examining the door he found it unlocked, and ran after the suspi-cious individual, captured him, and handed him over to a policeman. The store was then examined, when it was found that the safe had been opened and ransacked. The orisoner was taken to the Central Station, where he was rscognized as John Cronin, who was arrested some time ago on the charge o' robbing a store on Market street. He will have a hearing at the Central Station this afternoon.
