A REPENTANT CRIMINAL.

Singular Letter from Michael Kennedy, the Robber - He Confesses His Guils, and Wishes to be Saved from a Felon's Grave.

From the Chicago Republican.

Michael Kennedy, one of the most notorious criminals of this city, whose career during the past few years has been marked by numerous offenses against the law, was lately sentenced to ten years' imprisonment in the State Penitentiary. His operations within the last two or three weeks are well known. During his confinement in the County Jail he partially confessed a number of crimes he had committed. Being a victim to consumption, and not expecting to long survive his life of outlawry, he has become repentant. The following letter, written to the Deputy Superintendent of Police, reveals much of the inner feeling of the man, which, had he not been detected in his crime, might never have been brought to From the Chicago Republican. his crime, might never have been brought to

in his crime, might never have been brought to light:—

"CHICAGO, Oct. 21, 1857.—Captain John Nelson, peputy Superintendent of Police—Sir:—I am induced to write you, owing to the peculiar circumstances that have within the last few weeks surrounded me. You will be aware ere this reaches you that I have been sentenced to Stato's Prison on two charges, for the term of ten years. I have no complaint to make against any one, nor would I ask for sympathy, only that I believe I am almost friendless, and slowly but surely dying of a disease that must prove fatal. See I have been your duty to detect and prosecute criminals like myself, yet the treatment I have ever received from your hands, and those connected with you, must ever command my respect. As I have said, I am sentenced to the Penitentiary for ten years. As you know, my life at the longest cannot be more than one year. Since my last confinement I have suffered much, and thought much of the past, and the remorse of a guity conscience tells me there is more in the future than I, in my recklessness, have thought of, and what little of life is left should be devoted to a better purpose, to atone for the past. I do not think; a reformation impossible, as even gre-ter criminals than myself have reformed. One thing is certain, I shall never offend the laws again as I have done, if turned loose to morrow. What I would wish to say is this.—I go to the State's Prison with a firm determination to be a better man. I save not long to live, but when my last lew days should draw nigh, I do not wish to be burled as a felon, for the sake of relatives whom I have already filled with sorrow.

"I would ask your assistance—yourlympathy so far st his if at such a time an application should be made for you to assist in saving me trom a felon's grave, that you will look upon it favorably.

"Believe me ever respectfully yours."
