Printing One Thousand Years Ago. An extraordinary discovery has been made of press in India. a press in India. When Warren Hastings was Governor-General of India, he observed that in the district of Benares a little below the surface of the earth, is to be found a stratum of a kind of fibrous woolly substance of various thick-perses, in horizontal tayers. Major Roeback, informed of this, went out to a spot where an excavation had been made displaying this most singular phenomenon. In digging somewhat deeper for the purpose of further research, they laid open a vault, which, on further examination, proved to be of some size, and to their astonishment they found a kind of printing press set up in a vault and on it movable types placed as if ready for printing. Every inquiry was set on foot to ascertain the probable period at which such an instrument could have been placed there, for it was evidently not of modern origin, and from all the Major could collect it appeared probable that the press had remained there in the state in which it was found for at least one thousand years. We believe the worthy Major, on his re-turn to England, presented one of the learned associations with a memoir containing many curious speculations on the subject.
