

Effects of the Severe Cold—A Man and a Woman Frozen to Death. A number of persons were severely frost-bitten during the severe snow storm on Thursday night, and two persons, a man and a woman, were frozen to death.

Information was lodged at the Station House, and Officer Miller being conducted to the spot, had the remains of the poor woman conveyed to the dead-house. Bird was held as a witness of the inquest by Coroner Lybelle.
