FROM WASHINGTON. Commissioner Rollins to be Suspended. Special Dispatch to The Evening Telegraph.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 29.—There is a rumor today that Mr. Rollins is to be suspended at once. Secretary McCulloch had a long interview with the President to-day, under-tood to relate to Mr. Rollins. What the result of it was is not known, but the rumor probably originated from this circumstance.
