We present below the first instalment of the fruits of our efforts to expose to the public gaze the records of the Sapreme Court in the matter of naturalization. Let the people read and ponder them before determining to cast their votes for Seymour and Blair.

How the Business is Done.

When a large staff of reporters of THE EVEN-ING TELEGRAPH presented themselves to Colone J. Ross Snowden, the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, yesterday afternoon, that gentlemau, in compliance with the instructions of the court, placed every facility for the successful prosecution of the work at their disposal. One o the elerks of the office was detailed to take charge of the documents, and under his eye the work of inspection commenced and was prosecuted from three to six o'clock, the only hours when it would not interfere with the regular and legitimate duties of the office. In the three hours thus far at our command we have been able to obtain only 754 names, which are given below. To obtain these the same number of naturalization papers had to be carefully examined. In the course of that examination several curious facts were developed, among which were the following:-

In the great majority of cases, the applicants for naturalization testified under oath to the fact tha, they had arrived in this country before attaining their mojority, and on papers thus made out their claim to citizenship was allowed.

In several cases, as will be seen by inspecting the lists given below, the voucher had not been signed. Sometimes it was entirely blank, and at others the name of the voucher had been filled in, but he had not affixed his signature. In one case a name had been written in ink, wiped out by a finger, and another scrawling name written over it in pencil, and barely

Thus far we have not encountered a single mention of the residence or pretended residence of the applicant. This was omitted in every case, we believe, until the application for a mandamus made in behalf of THE EVENING TELEGRAPH, when the alarm was at once taken, and the -e inserted in the papers, in

the requirements of the law. It will be seven get through with the papers in which these omissions occur, and be enabled to present, along with the name, the residence of the James Conley, naturalized citizens. In the case of the omitted papers, the recipients can be placed on the assessment rolls in any precinct in the city, and there maintain their right to vote.

Mutual Vouchers.

As will be seen by reference to the list dated September 21, Henry Holl acted as the voucher of Henry Ernst, and Henry Ernst then turned about and did a like service for Henry Hall, One of these men, by his own confession, has been guily of perjury; for one of them swore that he was a citizen of the United states, and in that capacity vouched for the other, and yet was not clothed with the rights of citizenship until his friend, the newly made citizen, had vouched for him, and thus enabled him to procure his own papers. Doubliess there have been many more such cases, to which we shall call public attenion, as fast as they come under our attention.

Professional Vouchers

are remarkably numerous. The following lists were made out just as they came to our hands in miscellaneous order. No one day is complete, as ar as we know, so that we can not give the entire work of the "professionals" for any one day.
