We continue to-day the list of foreign-born persons—nearly all of whom, as before, allege that they came to this country before attaining the age of eighteen—who have been clothed with all the rights and privileges of citizenship by the Supreme Court of the State. Our reporters could obtain access to the records of the Court yesterday afternoon for an hour and a half only, so that the list which we present to-day, containing 556 names, is somewhat shorter than that presented yesterday. As stated previously, the work of no one day is yet complete, the petitions being piled up miscellaneously in the Prothonotary's office. Below will be found portions of the work of September 15, 16, 17, 21, and 24, that of the two last-named days being in addition to what we published yesterday. The following is a summary of the number of naturalizations thus far published:—

The "Professional" Vouchers.

Two of the men whom we classed among the professional vouchers yesterday have been arrested already, and held in bail to answer to the charge of perjury, as will be seen elsewhere. These are James A. Watson and Ernest Gentner. In the case of Watson we have already detected 31 petitions on which he figures as voucher, and in Gentner's case 16 of the same character. That this embraces the whole of their reckless swearing we do not believe, and not until every naturalization paper granted by the Supreme Court at the present term has been examined can the full enormity of their guilt and that of the other professionals be disclosed. In each particular case an indictment for perjury would lie, and if they are tried and punished on every separate allegation of perjury that can justly be brought against them, they are likely to get their just deserts, and to be rendered inactive Democrats for many years to come.

PHILADELPHIA TRADE REPORT.

FRIDAY, Oct. 2.—The Flour Market is dull, and only a few hundred barrels were taken by the home consumers at \$5 50/75 for superfine; \$8 50/75 for extra; \$9 50/75 for old spring wheat.

There is not much activity in the wheat market, and prices are weak. Sales of red at \$2 20/25, and 1600 bushels amber at \$2 30. Rye may be quoted at \$1 00/115 per bushel for Pennsylvania; 1000 bushels sold at the former rates.

The Stock Market was dull this morning, with the exception of Lehigh Navigation, which sold largely at 24 1/2, closing at the latter rate, an advance of 1/4. It was bid for 24 1/2 by the National City Bank for preferred, 30 for Morris Canal; 71 for Morris Canal preferred; 14 for Susquehanna Canal; and 30 for Wyoming Valley Canal.
