

Condition of the Public Press in France.

A table headed "Three Months of Liberal Empire," and published by the Paris Temps, gives a good idea of the condition of the public press in France. "Announced on the 13th of January, 1867, as the crowning of the edifice of the 21st of December, the memorable law on the press is in full activity."

The Paris Figaro recently published a letter to M. Pinard, Minister of the Interior, from its editor, M. de Villeneuve. It included a long list of the distribution of the Figaro of the 1st of September, of the number of copies taken by one hundred and sixty booksellers, whose names were given, in all parts of Paris; and it showed the sale in the capital to be 24,800 copies, or 1500 more than before.
