

NEWS SUMMARY.

Early yesterday morning Charles Simmons, colored, residing 10 St. Mark street, was attacked by his wife and badly cut on the head with a razor. The wound is considered dangerous. The injured man was removed to a hospital, and his wife was locked up for a hearing.

LOCAL AFFAIRS.

John Kingland, who was confined in the Western Penitentiary, after a sentence of twelve years, for the murder of his wife, in the western part of the State, stabbed himself to the heart on Saturday. The knife with which the suicide was committed was secretly made by the deceased from a piece of iron that he had concealed within his cell. He was fifty-eight years of age, and had served about two years of his sentence. An inquest was held on the body by the Coroner, and a verdict rendered in accordance with the fact.
