THE ALABAMA CLAIMS.

The Question as Viewed from an English Standpoint. A letter, written by a well-known English author to a gentleman residing in this city, has been handed us for publication. We present it below, interlarded with a few comments:--

LONDON, June 5, 1869, -The excitement here about the Alabama difficulty is dying out, and I am glad of it, for now I hope that an era of good feeling will set in, and that the questions at issue will be discussed in a dispassionate manner, with a view to an early settlement. With regard to our international relations. I think that Americans are systematically unjust to us. You cite the Alabama as evidence of the rule of our-conduct during your civil war, and take no note of the other ships which our Government stopped, and that, too, by an illegal stretch of power, for which in no case they were adjudged to pay damages. If ever we go to war, which Providence forbid, and your Government preserves a neutrality as faithfully as did ours, we shall be perfectly satisfied. If you let an Alabama or two escape, we shall forgive you. We wish no better measure than we gave. A sarge portion of our people-possibly a majority-sympathized with the South : but why shouldn't they? When we were at war with Russia, a great portion of your people sympathized with Russia, and we did not complain Why should we? The way in which the public take sides in fights outside their borders means little or nothing beyond caprice. The weakest side and the pluckiest has usually the most backers. When Prussia and Austria attacked Denmark, the majority of our people sided with Denmark because it was the weakest, though Denmark was quite in the wrong. But neither Austria nor Prussia complained of the direction of our sympathies, or felt the least ag-

grieved at our folly. Then, too, why does Mr. Summer exhaust all his indignation on England, and forget France, which was anxious to acknowledge the Confederacy, and only held back because we refused to move? I fear you think far too much of England, and lay far too much stress on our criticism. I wish you could feel as indifferent to our criticism as we do to yours. Why, your newspapers and politicians are always snapping at us, and we only laugh! (You laughed on the other side of your mouth over Summer's speech, and the rejection of Reverdy Johnson's treaty.-EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH.) England seems to have no friends in America; America has innumerable friends in England-friends who are accused of loving you better than their own countrymen. Your aversion to us we are sorry for, chiefly on your own account. It does you infinite injury (How sad!-Epiron EVENING TELEGRAPH), and shuts us off from many services we should gladly render. I wish we could do something to soften your hearts [Pay our bill .-EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH), but I fear there is no hope of that until you clearly feel that you are our superiors at every point. May Heaven hasten the day! [Amen!-EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH.] That you should take the lead in the world, and lead well and wisely, is a consummation we anticipate with no sort of jealousy. (If this be so, English sentiment has indeed been sadly misapprehended in this country .- EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH. ]

One reason, I imagine, of your inability to get on with us, is our similarity in characters, Our differences appear to have a family acrimony and intensity. Before the war we did not get on a white better than we do now, and were the Alabama out of the way, I have not the least doubt your politicians would discover a new bone of contention. I therefore carnestly desire that your German immigration may increase, and the Irish diminish. A large infusion of German blood would do wonders in softening the family bitterness. Then, too, I look for a great change when your Atlantic population is balanced by that on the Pacific, and you begin to think of Old England much as we do of Holland. To time alone, indeed. I look for the improvement of our relations. Your lealousy and antipathy are not to be removed by the mere removal of pretexts; the spirit never wants pretexts, and finds one as easily in a pin-head as in a mountain.

You see I write unreservedly and, I would have you understand, simply in a political sense. For icans personally I have the strongest liking.

indeed, some of the sweetest natures I have ever known have come from your side of the ocean. I like much to hear them talk about England, and Southerners appear to treat us quite as had as Northerners. If we are responsible for the Alabama, the South shows no sense of our favors; and I fancy if you set about fighting us, South Carolina would be quite as eager for the fray as Massachusetts. No: the truth is it is out of our power to please you. It is our very existence that is your offense, and clearly recognizing the fact does much to promote our equanimity. If we could cease to be, however, I am afraid you would be very unhappy [Oh very !--EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH), and produce many a eulogistic history of the old fatherland. I never read an American criticism on our internal

politics that is not touched more or less with absurdity; and the same is true of French criticism, and, indeed, of all foreign criticism. And so I am ready to believe that our views of your great civil war are equally at fault. And that being the case, you should try to excuse our blunders by saying, "They really cannot see." [We do say that continually.-EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH). I know you cannot understand us (but we do understand you perfectly .-EDITOR EVENING TELEGRAPH), and you should know that we cannot understand you. If this fact were duly recognized, it might do much to subdue irritation with unfair criticism. It would be easy to multiply considerations like these ad injuitum. Only of this be assured: if you hate us, we shall do our best to love you. Even if we did wrong in favoring the South, would it not have been worse had we disliked you indefinitely ?
