THE BALTIMORE SÆNGERFEST.

Grand Turn Out of the German Societies-Reception of the Visitors in Baltimore-Interest-ing Musical Performances. rom Our Own Correspondent.

BALTIMORE, July 11, 1869. This city is in a state of enthusiasm and exciteent on the occasion of the great National Sungerfest, which is to be participated in by seventeen hundred singers, attached to societies from all parts of the United States. The greater portion of these arrived on Saturday evening by the train which left Philadelphia between 3 and 4 o'clock, and they were received with every possible demonstration and evidence of welcome. The principal public and private buildings were handsomely decorated and illuminated, and handsome archways of evergreen, bearing suitable inscriptions, are erected at the corners of several of the principal streets. Concordia Hall, the Eutaw House, the Maryland Institute, and other large buildings present a very handsome appearance, but Barnum's Hotel is conceded to be one of the most hands me in the city.

When the societies from New York and Philadelphia arrived at the depot last night, a salute of twenty-five guns was fired from Federal Hill, and a handsome display of fireworks made at Broadway and Baltimore street. A procession was then formed. and proceeded to Monument Square, where an address of welcome was made by the Mayor.

The Baltimore societies sang a welcoming song, composed by B. F. Schneider, which was followed by the "Ecce Quam Bonum," both pieces being given in capital style.

Just as the reception ceremonies were about to conclude, the platform upon which the Mayor, the officers of the Sængerfest, the reporters, and others were standing, broke down, and for a time there was considerable excitement. Fortunately no one was hurt.

The line of march was then taken up and proceeded to Concordia Hall, where Mr. George P. Steinbach, President of the Executive Committee, made an address of welcome. Yesterday evening the oratorio of the Messiah was sung in fine style at the hall of the American Institute. An immense audience was in attendance, and the performance was heartily enjoyed. The hall is finely decorated with evergreens, flags, and drapery, and presents a very handsome appearance. The oratorio was given under the direction of Professor Leuschen, and the solos were sung by Madame Rotter, soprano; Madame Frederici, contraito; Herr Himmer, tenor and Joseph Hermanns, basso. The orchestra and chorus were large and unusually effective.
