### NEWS SUMMARY.

## City Affairs.

-This evening Hon. Asa Packer, Democratic candidate for Governor, will be serenaded at the Merchants' Hotel.

-John Clark, twenty-eight years old, a resident of Schuylkill county, was admitted to the Penasylvania Hospital yesterday, with a broken leg, received at Honeybrook Coal Mines.

-Workmen have resumed the laying of the large gas main on Ninth street. Before the winter closed Chesnut street had been reached, and yesterday the street at this point was broken and the laying continued northward.

-A young woman was detested on Monday in the act of leaving the Lincoln Institute, in which she was employed, with table covers and other property of the Home in her possession. Subsequently, the residence of her mother was searched, and other goods belonging to the institute were found there, The mother was also arrested, and both were vesterday held for trial.

-Two young men were arrested yesterday by Policeman McConnell, after they had been seen to climb into the yard of a dwelling back of No. 285 North Twelfth street, the occu pants of which are out of the city. The movements of the men were observed by Mr. J. C Randall, from one of the windows of his residence, No. 1209 Race street. Alderman Kerr committed the accused for trial.

-Richard Landy, a policeman in the First district, was attracted on Monday evening to the house of James Campbell, on Alter street. above Twentieth, by a report that a man was whipping his wife. A crowd of women and children was found gathered in front, and the officer broke in the back door and entered. Almost immediately after a gun was dis charged, the load from which passed through the brim of the policeman's hat. Campbell was arrested with the gun in his hand. On a hearing before Alderman Kerr, Campbell de nied the shooting, though at the same time said he was very drunk. He was held to an-swer the charge of assault and battery with intent to kill.

Addresses were made by Rev. Dr. Jastrow and Rev. Hirsh. The corner-stone was laid at the northeast corner of the foundation by the President of the congregation, Joseph Einstein. It contained the following:-A copy of the Holy Bible, translated by the late Rev. Isaac Leeser, and presented by Wm, B. Hackenburg; copy of the 26th volume of the "Occident," being the only volume and the last ever published by Meyer Salzberger: the first and the last numbers of the "Occident," the first from April. 1843, and the latter from March, 1868, published by the late Rev. Isaac Leeser; a list of the members and seatholders of the congregation; an extract from the minutes of the coxgregation of the resolution relating to the new synagogue; list of officers of the congregation and building committee; names of the architect and builder: the President and Vice President of the United States; Secretary of State; the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania; the Secretary of the Commonwealth: the Mayor of the city; Presidents of Select and Common Councils; list of all the Jewish congregations in the city, together with the names of their Presidents and Clergy; the city newspapers, among which was one of the first copies of the Ledger; gold and silver coins of the U. ### Bierstadt.

#### A correspondent writes from Paris: --

An artist who met with immense success in Paris this year is the famed American painter, M. Bierstadt. He is located at the Grand Hotel, and his salon there is one of the most interesting in a social and artistic point of view. It is the gathering place of celebrities in the literary world, be they English, French, or American. Three magnificent paintings, which have not yet been exhibited, are an additional attraction. One is called "Bridal Veil," a view of the Yosemite Valley, and most propitious is the name given to this superb work. It was commenced at Rome and finished in Paris. A golden mist is seen to rise as if lifted from the front of the rocks by some fairy with rosy-tipped fingers. As the veil of haze rises, the swift Mereid river is disclosed, surging at 'be foot of the crags, from the interstices of which shoot forth twigs of maple, branches of daring oak, and cotton bush. A figure or two on horseback stand about in mute contemplation on swelling knolls in the front ground, and under the shade of gigantic oaks. The small but well-proportioned stature of the men makes the colossal ridge of rocks appear all the more imposing and majestic compared thus to the smallness of the "lords of creation." The other work which vies with "Storm on the Prairie." A drove of powerful buffaloes are wading through a stream which divides the forest opposite from the prairie, whence a mighty wind is blowing, and over which a fearful cloud is gathering It seems to come along like an exterminating decree of glooming fatality. The willow and cottonwood are twisting, the blue rock in the distance frowns on, and the short underwood vegetation writhes on the bushy hills to the right. One gleam of sunshine guides th terrified drove. Two paintings such as these are sufficient for the reputation of one man in his lifetime, and the crowd of foreign artistwho are ever pouring in to see them envy such sites as those which M. Bierstadt is determined to consecrate his brush to. "Do nothing but American scenery," he says very quickly. only it must be owned that he "does" that "little" in a leviathan spirit. An habitue of M. Bierstadt's appears to be the other great painter who sees "great," the celebrated marine artist M. Gudin. He is so remarkable a man, and his life, both before he went to America as a marine officer, and since, has been so eventful, so full of incident and success, that I shall shortly forward to your readers a few features that illustrate the man and his works entirely. The owner of a name highly revered and dear to American lovers of literature is that of Dr. Holland. I connect if with that of M. Bierstadt and M. Gudin because I had the pleasure of seeing him "think" before "Bridal Veil," and we were, in company with these eminent artists, on a visit to the collection of the Marquis of Hertford, which is so difficult of access, and at the outer gates of which so many say "sesame" in vain.
