## MEWS SUMMARY. Ulty Affairs.

-Rev. Isaac T. Hartley, pastor-elect of the second Reformed Church, Seventh street, above Brown, will preach his first sermon, since his

soldiers and sailors against the Government. -The Nez-Perce Indians, of Idaho, have consented to go on their reservation, but complain that it is too small, and with reason, the Superintendent savs.

-Mr. Magee, a Democrat, was expelled from the Alabama Assembly yesterday, on the ground that during the war he was a county commissioner. The expulsion of other Democrats is expected.

-A suit brought by Outley, Haskell & Co. and T. M. Walker, of Pennsylvania, against the Terre Haute and Alton Railroad Company, involving the possession of coal mines valued at \$200,000, was decided in favor of the plaintiffs, at Belleville, Ill., yesterday.




