OBITUARY.

Comte de Regnaud-De-Saint-Jean-D'Angelly. The cable announces the death of Auguste-Michel Marie-Etlenne, Comte de ' Regnaud-De-Saint-Jean D'Angelly, Marshal of France, who expired yester day at Paris, aged seventy-five years. He was the son of the famous French general of the same name, and was born on the 29th of July, 1794. He entered the military school of St. Germain in 1811, and in 1812 he was assigned to service as sub-lieutenant in the grand army designed for the invasion of Rusita. At the battle of Leipsic his regiment was almost entirely cut to pieces, but he made his escape and took part in the concluding campaigns of Napoleon. On the field of Waterlos he distinguished himself by his valor, and was nominated chef d'escauron by the Emperor. He accepted service under the restoration, and distinguished himself by his military talents. In 1825 he accompanied General Maison to the Morea, and took part in the campaign there, winning high honors. In 1840 he was appointed to the military command of the Department of Meurthe, and in 1848, on the establishment of the republic, he was placed in command of the Army of the Alps, and shortly he was made General of Division. In 1849 he was returned ot the Legislative Assembly by the Charente Inferieure, and for about a fortnight in 1851 he held the portfolio of the War Department. After the coup d'etat he became a Senator, and in 1859 he was created a Marshal of France He was made Grand Officer of the Legion of Honor n January, 1949, and in December of the same year e received the Grand Cross. He was Vice-President of the Senate in 1862, and at the time of his death he was Colonel of the Imperial Guards.

Claude Alphonse Delange. This distinguished French lawyer and statesman, whose death is announced by cable, was born at Varzy, in the Department of Nievre, on the 6th of April, 1797. He studied law under the patronage of M. Dupin, Jr., and was admitted to the Paris bar he speedily acquired distinction, and was elected a member of the Council in 1831 and battonier in 1837. In 1840 he was elected Advocate-General of the Cour de Cassation, and in 1847 Procureur-Seneral of the Cour Royal of Paris. In spite of a litter opposition in 1846, he was elected Deputy for in the Department of Nievre, and his seat until the revolution of 1849, when he resumed his place at the Paris bar. He embraced the cause of Louis Napoleon, and in 1850 he was appointed President of the Bureau de l'Assistance Judiciaire de la Cour de Cassation. In 1851, shortly after the coup a'ctat, he was nominated President of the section of the Interior for Public Instruction and Worship in the Council of State; and he was one of the commissioners chosen to represent the Government in the deliberations of the Senate relative to the re-establishment of the empire. In 1852 he became Procureur-General of the Cour de Cassation in place of M. Dupin, and in December of the same year he was appointed President of the Cour Paris. and WILB Senator. In addition, he was a member of the Municipal and Departmental Commission of the Seine and of the Imperial Council of Public Instruction. In 1858 M. Delange succeeded General Espinasse as Minister of the Interior, and in 1859 he was appointed by decree Minister of Justice, with the title of Keeper of the Seals. This office he resigned June 23, 1863. He was chosen first Vice-President of the Senate on the 1sth of October, 1863, in place of M. Rouland, and on the 5th of March, 1859, he was elected a member of the Academy of Moral and Political Sciences. M. Delange was a Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor, and he was the author of a work entitled "Traite sur les Societes Commerciales, and of several articles on jurisprudence contributed to the Gazette des Tribunaux.
