

THE RIVAL OF NIAGARA.

The Great Cataract in South America—Nearly Eight Hundred Feet Fall—A Unique of Mass White Foam.

Mr. Richard Brown writes to the London Times on the 20th inst.— In the month of April last, a waterfall of most unusual height was discovered on the Potaro, a tributary of the Essequibo River, by Mr. C. Brown of the Geological Survey of British Guiana.

As a discoverer of the Great Kaizer Falls, and the director to the successful expedition which we were permitted to accompany, should have the telling of his own story, yet I can understand that his friends in Georgetown will be anxious to hear of one of his successes. The fall has been described, according to the observations taken on the spot, and by Mr. Brown at the bottom, and by my colleague, Mr. Mitchell, at the top, of 750 feet.
