

NEWS SUMMARY.

City Affairs. The Republican Convention in the First Senatorial district finished its labors yesterday by the nomination of Joseph R. Lyndall.

Domestic Affairs. The dental profession of Ohio is in convention at Columbus.

There is a movement in the Legislature of North Carolina having for its object the impeachment of Governor Holden.

The Legislature of Alabama has elected Goldthwaite, Democrat, United States Senator, by a majority of one over all the votes cast.

The Crispin strike of New York city still continues, all the negotiations between the manufacturers and workmen having proved fruitless.

The Bloomingdale, New York, Deaf and Dumb Asylum, having five hundred inmates, has recently lost one hundred and sixty-two by death.

The breakers at the English cable are located one ten miles and the other about sixty-five miles from the American shore.

The Russian government has in its employ a number of American workmen, engaged in manufacturing mitrailleuses.

A Tours despatch of the 5th says the German forces engaged in the battle of yesterday north of Orleans embraced the united armies of Frederick Charles, the 3d, 9th, and 10th Corps under the Duke of Mecklenburg.

The official reports of the battle near Orleans show that the Prussians attacked each corps d'armee separately, in greater force, thus repulsing the left of the Army of the Loire.
