Booth as "King Lear." Mr. Booth played "King Lear" last evening at the Walnut to a large audience, and earned the cordial thanks of every lover of dramatic art by restoring Shakespeare's text. Leaving poetry and propriety out of the queetion, the tragedy as Shakespeare wrote it is so much more effective in representation than Tate's adaptation that it is disgraceful the latter should have kept possession of the stage so long. Mr. Booth's impersonation of "King Lear" is artistic in an eminent degree, and it is based upon an intellectual and scholarly conception of the character. Not a point is missed from first to last, and in many of the scenes Mr. Booth's interpretation throws a new light upon the character. As an artistic whole it surpasses the "Lear" of Mr. Forrest in many particulars, Mr. Booth's exquisite taste in costume and "make-up" rendering his impersonation much the most picturesque of the two and the most satisfactory to the eye. Where Mr. Forrest, however, is greatest Mr. Booth is weakest, and his performance, very excellent as it is, lacks the one thing necessary to make it great inspiration. "King Lear" is a valuable addition to Mr. Booth's repertoire, and although it is not his best role, it is one that admirers of the Shakespearian drama can witness with much pleasure.
