The upper stories and roof were entirely burned out, and their occupants lost all their goods either by fire or water. The fice originated in the apartments occupied by Philip Rukeber, who states that he left his kerosene lamp burning "a little" when he went out before 9 o'clock. None of the occupants of the building were insured. The owner, Mr. Schaeffer, is out of the city, so that it was impossible to ascertain as to his insurance. The loss will be about \$600 to the building, besides that suffered by the inmates.
