

THE NINTH CENSUS.

The Enumeration Complete—The Aggregate Population of the Country 38,535,153, an Increase of 22 5/8 Per Cent. in Seven Years—Comparisons with the Past Population. Complete returns of the recent census from all the States and Territories have been received at the Census Bureau in Washington, by which the aggregate population of the country is shown to be 38,535,153. The revision of these returns will necessarily make some changes, but they will probably not be material enough to affect the aggregate, or the relative rank of the States.

It will be noticed that two States, Maine and New Hampshire, show a slight decrease in the population as compared with 1850. This is the first time that the decennial enumeration has shown a decrease in any State, but between 1850 and 1860 New Hampshire and Vermont remained almost stationary, the increase in the former State being but 1/45 per cent., and in the latter only 2/31 per cent.

The gradual progress of the population of the entire country since the first census enumeration, that of 1790, is shown in the following table. The population, in 1870, was 38,535,153, an increase of 22 5/8 per cent. since 1850, and of 35 1/2 per cent. since 1820.
