WASHINGTON, March 23.—The President sent the following message to Congress this alternoon: — To the Senate and House of Representatives:—A condition of affairs now exists in some of the States of the Union rendering life and property insecare, and the carrying of the mails and the collection of the revenue dangerous. The proof that such a con-dition of affairs exists in some localities is now be-tore the Senate.

dition of affairs exists in some localities is now be-fore the Senate. That the power to correct these evils is beyond the control of the States authorities, I do not doubt. That the powers of the Executive of this United States, acting within the limits of existing laws, is sufficient for the present emergencies, is not clear. Therefore, I urgently recommend such legislation as in the judgment of Congress shall effectually secure life, liberty, and property in all parts of the United States. It may be expedient to provide that such law as shall be passed in pursuance of this recommenda-mon shall expire at the end of the next session of Congress.
