THE PHILADELPHIA ALMSHOUSE. It appears from the annual statement of the Guardians for the Relief and Employment of the Poor of Philadelphia for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1870, that the appropriations made to the Guardians last year amounted to \$422,793-25, all of which except a few thousand dollars was expended, and the net cost of operations, after deducting receipts paid into the treasury, was \$378,353-91.

The returns for last year, as compared with those of former years, present a favorable contrast in several particulars, the average weekly cost of each Alms-house inmate and the net expenditures being smaller than at any time since 1863. It is evident, however, that, under the present system, even the most careful attention cannot prevent the city from being subjected to unnecessarily heavy burdens.
