DICKINSON COLLEGE.

Commencement Week at Carlisle - The Concluding Exercises - The Honorary Degrees Conferred. From Our Own Correspondent

CARLISLE, Pa., June 8. Taking up my account of commencement week at Dickinson, where I left off in 'my previous letter, I come to the address delivered on Tuesday evening before the literary societies by the Rev. B. F. Brooke, of Pittsburg, on "The Resources and Reities of the American Educated Young Man." The speaker, who is a graduate of the college class of 1842, and now a Protestant Episcopal clergyman, gave an old-time Fourth-of-July style of an oration on the duties, privileges, and powers of young men educated in the lines of American thought and feeling. The address was characterized by a scholarly diction, great earnestness, and a high range of thought. He was followed by Horatio King, Esq., of the class of 1858, now editor of the New York Star, who read a poem entitled "Mc-Feeny; or, Political Ambition:" a satire," which was remarkable for fis humor, wit, and lively fancies. Last evening, the address before the Alumni Association was delivered by the Rev W. J. Stevenson, of the class of 1888. It was entitled "Breadth," and was a capital effort, fresh and powerful, and eliciting frequent applause.

The awards of the Pierson prizes-a gold and silver medal-for oratery, the contest for which by members of the Junior class came off on Monday, as already stated, have been announced. The gold medal was awarded to G. R. Willis, of Baltimore. But in the numerical merit scale for determining the award, Mr. Willis had 497% and D. J. Myers, of Philadelphia, 496%. This very slight difference in the estimates of the Committees of Award was a fair index of popular sentiment, and with the consent of the committees, the President of the college announced to-day that another medal would be prepued and presented to Mr. Myers.

To-day the exercises of commencement week were brought to a close, and they never ran more smoothly or brilliantly. Francis A. Riggin, of Baltimore, was awarded the salutatory honors, and William H. Dashiell, of Georgetown, D. C., the valedictory address. The graduating class included seventeen in number.

HONORARY DEGREES. The honorary degree of LL D. was conferred on the Rev. E. R. Ames, D. D., one of the Bishops of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and on the Hon J. A. J. Creswell, Postmaster-General of the United States, a graduate of the college, of the class of

The degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred on the Rev. B. F. Brooke, of Pittsburg, of the class of 1841, and on the Rev. E. A. Johnson, editor of the Pittsburg Christian Advocate. The honorary degree of M. A. was conferred on the Rev. John E. Cookman and the Rev. William M. Fresinger.

The routine of the week was rounded out by the customary levee at the President's mansion, and with it closed an exceedingly pleasant and successful commencement week at Dickinson.
