AND COLLECTORS. The Commissioners of Beaver. County would estructly call the attention of the above named officers to the following sections of an Act passed in 1856: Relative to the sale of Lands for the non-

pagment of Taxes

Section 2. That from and after the passage of this act, assessors, supervisors, and collect tors of road and school taxes be, and they are hereby required 'to make their returns for the neredy required to make their returns isr the collection of all taxes on unseated lands, on or before the first day of January in each and every year, and if not so made by said assess-ors and collectors, such returns shall not thereors any collectors, such returns shall not there-after be received, nor shall such taxes be a lien on real estate: Provided, That this section shall not be construed to exempt any such as-sessors and collectors, and their bail, from lin-bility for not making their returns according to law

law. Section 3. That it shall be the duty of super visors and collectors of road taxes, and of all collectors of any other taxes whatever; to make return to the County Commissioners of any exhonerations claimed by them, on or before the forst day of January in each year; and it shall net be lawful fos the said County Commissioners to grant any exhonerations after that time, nor for the county Treasurer to sell any lands which shall have been returned and taxes exhonerated, after the said time.
