## Report of the Board of Revenue Commissioners.

Total valuation of State, \$668,780,224.  
Increase in three years, \$7,418,799.  
Added by Revenue Board, \$231,827 upon the returns of fourteen counties, viz: Allegheny, \$1,210,000; Luzerne, \$24,700; Schuylkill, \$10,373; Fayette, \$21,410; remainder in Cambria, Clarion, Fulton, Forest, Monroe, Sullivan, Wayne, Westmoreland and Wyoming. The assessments of Beaver county were approved and adopted unanimously.

## PROPERTY SUBJECT TO STATE TAX.

The following is the valuation of several of the counties of Pennsylvania, as determined by the Board of Revenue Commissioners, for the year 1857, to be and remain as the valuation of the property thereof, until the next meeting of the Board, which will be in three years - We give the county of Beaver and those contiguous to it:

Beaver—Property subject to three mill tax, \$3,240,373; property subject to one per cent tax, \$24,518; property subject to two per cent tax, \$1,800; tax on watches, \$104.25. Aggregate amount \$3,272,191.  
Allegheny—Property subject to three mill tax, \$25,989,417; property subject to one per cent tax, \$123,021; property subject to two per cent tax, \$78,400; tax on watches, \$792.00. Aggregate amount \$26,090,888.  
Butler—Property subject to three mill tax, \$3,093,898; property subject to one per cent tax, \$22,462; property subject to two per cent tax, \$1,100; tax on watches, \$63.75. Aggregate amount \$3,117,460.

## MEMBERS OF NON-CROSS SOCIETY.

It appears that the statement which we published in our last paper, concerning the arrest of McKim, in Luzerne county, after a desperate struggle with a "hoax." The following extracts we clip from the Philadelphia Evening Journal, the paper which first communicated the intelligence of the arrest.
