The bill for the sale of the Main line having passed both branches of the Legislature, it is now in the hands of the Governor for approval or disapproval. It provides for the sale of the Philadelphia and Columbia Railroad, the cana from Columbia to the junction at Duncan's Island, the Juniata Canal from thence to Hollidaysburg, the Allegheny Portage Bailroad, including new road to avoid inclined planes, and the canal from Johnstown to Pittsburgh, with Taylor. all the property belonging to, or in any wise connected therewith. The amount of money required for these works is to be not less than \$7,500,000; all of which is to be applied directly to the liquidation of the State debt, or paid into the Sinking Fund, originally established for that end. From the Louisville Journal of Friday. Yesterday afternoon the arguments o counsel were concluded in the case of the three negroes charged with the murder of the Joyce family in this county, several months ago. Judge Bullock then charged the jury, who retired, and in a short time returned with a verdict of "Not Guilty." It would have been impossible, we are told by lawyers, to render a different verdict considering the nature of the testimony introduced by the prosecution, which consisted, mainly of the statements of one of the negroes implicated in the crime Besides, Judge Bullock, in his charge, declared this evidence to be entitled to but little, if any
