RESOLUTION Proposing Amendments to the Constitution written.

ut the Commonicealth Resolved by the Senate and House of Repre sentatives of the Commonwdalth of Pennsylva-nia in General Assembly met: That the following amendments are proposed to the constitu-tion of the commonwealth, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article thereof. First Amendment.

There shall be an additional article to said stitution to be designated as article eleven

OF PUBLIC DEBTS. contingent, whether contracted by virtue of one or more acts of the general assembly, or at different periods of time, shall never exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars and the mon-ey arising from the creation of such debts shall be applied to the purpose for which it was ob-

to no other purpose whatever.

SEC. 2 In addition to the above limited power the State may contract debts to repel invasion, suppress insurrection, defend the State in war, or to redeem the present outstanding indebtedness of the state; but the money arising from the contracting of such debts, shall be applied to the purpose for which it was raised, or to repay such debts, and to no other purpose

whatever.
SEC. 3. Except the debts above specified, in sections one and two of this article; no debt whatever shall be created by, or on behalf of

sand dollars; which sinking fund shall consist of the net annual income of the public works, from time to time owned by the state, or the proceeds of the sale of the same, or any part there-of, and of the income or proceeds of sale of stocks owned by the state, together with other funds, or resources, that may be designated by law. The said sinking fund may be increased. from time to time, by assigning to it any part of the provisions of the Constitution, and were as the taxes, or other revenues of the state, not follows, viz: required for the ordinary and current expenses of government, and unless in case of war. invasion or insurrection, no part of the said sink-ing fund shall be used or applied otherwise than in extinguishment of the public debt, until the amount of such debt is reduced below the sum of five millions of dollars.

SEC. 5. The credit of the commonwealth shall not in any manner, or event, be pledged, or loaned to, any individual, company, corporation or association; nor shall the commonwealth hereafter become a joint owner, or stockholder. in any company, association, or corporation. SEC. 6. The commonwealth shall not assur the debt, or any part thereof, of any county, city, borough or township; or of sky corpora-tion, or association; unless such det shall have been contracted to enable the state to ropel in-vasion, suppress domestic insurrection, defend itself in time of war, or to assist the state in Propaged from a prescription of Sir James itself in time of war, or to assist the state in the discharge of any portion of its present in-
