The Massacre at Campore, of which some particulars are received, is probably the most treacherous and bloodiest act ever recorded in the history of any country— In the small fort at thit place, some 90 English troops, with ever 300 women and children, had taken refuge under the orders of Sir Hugh Wheeler. The extensive plain without the fort swarmed with thousands of the ferocious musineers under the command of Nena Sabib. The besieged waited and waited; but in vain, for relief.
