## Notice is Herby Given

That every person, except Justices of the Peace who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the government of the Commonwealth, or any other officer or agent of an incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or agent, who is or shall have been employed under the legislature, executive or judicial department of this State or of any city or incorporated district; and also that every member of Congress, or any other officer or agent of such corporation, or any incorporated city, or commissioners of any incorporated city, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Inspector, Judge, or Clerk of any election of the Commonwealth, and that no Judge, Inspector, or any other officer of such election, shall be eligible to any office to be then held.
