TIG GREAT ADVANCE IN COTTON.

Which it never reached before since it has been known as a staple. The price of Saturday, Jan. 31, before yesterday it suddenly jumped to eighty-nine cents in the forenoon, and in the afternoon sales were reported at the extraordinary price of ninety-six cents per pound. A party who purchased in the forenoon, received the afternoon price at \$40 per bale. At ninety-six cents per pound a bale of cotton is worth \$432. Before the war it sold at ten to twelve cents a pound or at \$45 or \$54 per bale. From present appearances it is possible that the present price, or \$96 per bale, is the present price is higher than it was before the invention of the cotton gin, by the negro of the South picked it with their fingers.

HORRIBLE MURDER.

A dispatch dated Saratoga, Pa., Feb. 3, says:—Intelligence has just reached here of a horrible murder having been committed early on Monday morning in the northern part of Columbia county. A stepmother named Sout murdered three of her step-children, aged respectively seven, nine and fourteen years, by covering their heads from the back with an axe, and afterwards threw their bodies into the fire. She is now confined in Columbia county jail.

FIGHT WITH INDIANS.

A dispatch dated Salt Lake City, Feb. 3, says:—On the morning of the 29th ult., Col. Connor had a four hours desperate fight with Indians on Bear River in Washington Territory, in which two hundred and twenty-four Indians were killed, and many are supposed to have been drowned. Our troops took 175 horses, and destroyed their lodges, provisions, &c. One loss was fifteen killed, including four officers, and thirty-eight wounded.
