

**A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSED**  
By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with the provisions of the tenth article of the Constitution, to be submitted to the people at the next general election, to-wit:

**ARTICLE I.**  
Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in a Governor, who shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election to the same office for one term only.

Section 1. The Legislative Power shall be vested in a Senate and a House of Representatives, who shall hold office for a term of two years, and shall be eligible for re-election to the same office for one term only.
