HOW TO FEED YOUNG HORSES. The adult horse, says the American Veterinary-Journal does not require so much of the flesh-making principle as the young and growing animat, but seems to require a greater variety. The adult merely requires enough to replace the waste-the wear and tear of his system. If he obtains more than this, the surplus is either excreted from the body, or else stored up within the same in form of fat; and every body knows that a fat horse or a fat man, are not best adapted for a race, nor hard labor ; but of all others (except those in a state of debility,) they 3363 are most subject to acute disease. With the young and growing animal, the case is different. Here we require bone, muscle and nerve. Oats, corn and pollard furifish the same. The colt obtains from its mother's 3361 milk all the elements of its own organization m a concentrated form-all that seems nocessary for developing bodily proportions and hereditary traits-therefore, when weaned, the colt must be furnished with the same convivalents in the form of fodder, ground oats, wheat, bran and meal.

If our readers desire to raise colts that shall remunerate them for the trouble and expense incurred, they must feed the same, during their minority, with a liberal hand. Any 1360 neglect at this period can never be made up in after life ; the subject will always remain lank and lean-hving monuments of their master's folly, or ignorance, as the case may ba. In addition to the food required for the colt's growth, we must also furnish enough to supply the wasto incurred by expenditure of muscular power. We all know that the young are very active and playful. Every ouscular movement involves an expenditure of the vital force, and thus exhausts the system ; therefore in view of developing their full 3::67 proportions, and promoting the integrity of the living mechanism, they niust have nutritive food and plenty of it. They are not, however, to have a large quantity at a time but little and often ; their stomach is small, not harger than that of a man. Should it be 369 over distended with coarse and innutritious food, the organs of respiration and circu lation become embarrassed, and the blood loaded with carbon. They require food often because the digestive organs are very active, and soon dispose of ordinary meal, then comes the sensation of hunger, which every one knows how to bear.

MANURE IN WINTER.

No mistake is more common, than to suppose that manures undergo no deleterious change from institution' during winter. It 14 true that from the immediate surface of the manure heap, the escape of ammonia is 3.27 not so great as during the summer; but all who have observed the fact, know, that the nen-conducting power of the immediate surface enables the centre or greater bulk of the man to decompose with rapidity; and in 3372 properly conducted manure sheds the current manares of the winter may be decomposed as well as in summer. Those who are sunplied with properly constructed sheds, including a cistern for the liquid drainage of the manure heap, and a pump for its frequent return to the top of the heap can contime making the compost, with a certainty of its being ready for spring use in that con-3374 dition as "short," but in the absence of pump and cistern arrangement, much manuro is wasted by fire fanging, even in the 3375 coldest weather. A well arranged compost heap my receive manures from the stable each morning. Muck may be co advied during the winter; and when the

TO FATTEN FOWLS.

For is may be fattened in four or five days by the following process : Set some rice over the fire with skimmed milk, as much as will serve for one day. Let it boil till the rice is swelled out ; add a tea-spoonful of sugar Feed the fowls four or five times a day in pans, and give them as much each time as will fill them. Great care must be taken 3379 that they have nothing sour given them, as that provents their fattening. Give them clean water or milk from rice to drink. STABLING COWS.

Milch cows should be stabled, especially at night and in unpleasant weather. This is too frequently neglected, the milch con receiving jio better care than those not in milk, and other cattle belonging to the 3381 farmer. This is a mistaken policy, if milch is the object desired. The more comfortable they can be kept, the greater product from a given amount of food. But we scarcely need dwell on this subject. Every one who keens a cow-knows that their comfort is worth looking after-and that the best management is the cheapest in the end, and certainly the most antisfactory."
