The science of numbers was next taken up for deliberation. Some instructive and worthy observations were made, teachers giving their method of imparting the science to younger and more tender minds. Previous to this discussion, all had concurred in the opinions given by one another; but now an important contrast emerged from the views delivered on the question, "should children when they begin arithmetic, immediately be instructed in the philosophy of its rules?"

The affirmative endeavor to sustain its side, by observing, that if a child, however young, perfectly understood the nature of his labor, and were acquainted with the intricacies connected with it, having those distinct shades, which appear to hang over it, dispelled, he could exert himself with greater encouragement and elation, than if he were compelled to commit long rules, and put them to actual performance, ignorant of their virtue and beauty.

After a few interesting remarks on school government, the Institute adjourned to meet at the new school house in Benner township Saturday, February 5th, 1899.
