NEW STATE ROAD. - We see it stated that the Commissioners appointed by an act of Assembly to view and lay out a new State road, to commence at Schroyer's Gap, Clinton county, run through the lower end of Miles township, Centre county, and across Hartley, Lewis, and West Buffalo townships in Union county, to the Rangler road on Spruce Creek, have met, performed their duty, and returned a survey and draft of the same to the courts of Centre, Cunton, and Union counties. This is an enterprise of great importance to the citizens of the region through which the road will pass, and when completed, will afford a direct and much shorter rout from Lock Haven to Lewisburg and Milton. The road passes through one of the finest lumber forests in the State. which must eventually give employment, by thus bringing lumber near a market, to hundreds of active, intelligent and enterprising men. The road as surveyed, is ten miles long, and is to be contracted by apportionment among the townships through which it passes. Green township has one and a half miles to build; Miles township about three; and Hartley, Lewis, and West-Buffalo five and a half miles.

The originator of this road, John McCall, Esq , deserves great credit for the energy he has displayed in procuring the surveys of this road, as well as the compromises he has succeeded in making to facilitate its completion. Opposition of a prejudicial character was made against the improvement, but Mr. McCall has succeeded in silencing all objections -- and when the road is completed and in running order, we suggest that it be called "McCall Turnpike." It would only be a just compliment to an enterprising man and valuable citizen.
